There are three target groups for individual mobility flows and five different types of individual mobility for students and staff.

SCHOLARSHIPS:

Host partners must provide incoming students and academic staff with the whole subsistence allowance defined in the call for the type of mobility and target group concerned.

Undergraduate	€1.000
Master	€1.000
PhD	€1.500
Post-doc	€1.800
Staff	€2.500

The Partner will inform the students/academic staff that subsistence allowances will be paid according to the exact period of stay (month or fraction of month) and the amount to be paid will be calculated accordingly.

TRAVEL AND INSURANCE COSTS:

Insurance and travel costs (flights) will be centrally managed and directly invoiced to the Coordinator, University of Murcia. The Coordinator shall provide full insurance cover (accidents, civil liabilities, health, and travel) for individuals participating in mobility and shall provide students and academic staff with travel tickets. Payment for travel is based on unit costs. Sending universities will advance all participants the costs of visa issue (transport to the nearest Consulate or Embassy as well as issue fees) up to the amount the student has been appointed for travelling. The University of Murcia will reimburse the total amount to the home university once the justifying invoices have been delivered.

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS:

There will be two call for applicants:

1st Call for applications:

Launch of the call: 15th December 2011 till 1st March 2012

Submission of the lists of scholarship holders to the European Commission: 15 days before the mobility starts and at latest 1st September 2012

Mobility starting on: 1st September to 31st December 2012 at latest.

2nd Call for applications:

Launch of the call: 15th December 2012 till 1st March 2013

Submission of the lists of scholarship holders to the European Commission: 15 days before the mobility starts and at latest 1st September 2013

Mobility starting on: 1st September to 31st December 2013 at latest.

SELECTION PROCCESS:

Candidates' assessment will be performed at local and central levels.

At local level:

The responsibility of **home universities** will be to validate applications (checking that the applicants meet the programme eligibility criteria). They will also asses each of the home applications according to the criteria as mentioned below and to upload the results to the corresponding section of the website.

The responsibility of **host universities** will be to let the corresponding administrative and/or academic bodies (faculties, departments, study programme coordinators etc.) asses each of the incoming applications received according to the criteria as mentioned below and upload the results to the corresponding section of the website.

When considered necessary, associate partners will carry out interviews with applicants in the home countries.

The responsibility of the **selection committee** (one representative of each of the European Universities, one representative of Lanzhou University and one representative of the WG3 for a transparent and efficient selection process (Asian institution) will be to tune the final list of selected applicants so that gender and social balance is achieved, the established academic percentages are respected and the academic priorities are enhanced. They will take into account the average qualification resulting from both the host and home universities assessment and will be able to review applications and consult about the qualifications appointed to any of the applications when necessary. The selection committee will also be in charge of solving claims, if any, and of publishing a reserve list.
